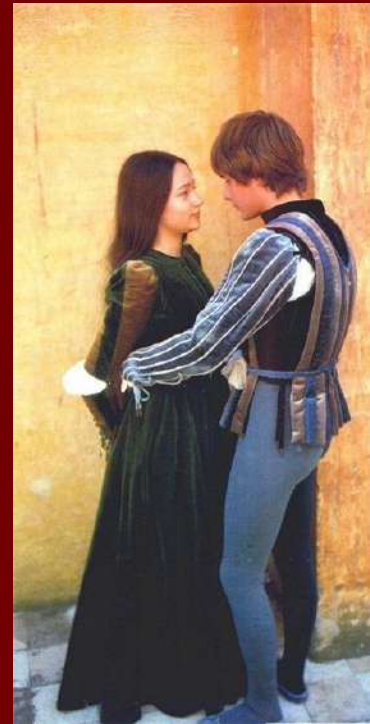
No 5 American actor, singer, and entertainer. He won nine Grammy Awards and an Oscar. He was renowned for his romantic singing style and velvety voice.



When he died, some journalists wrote: "To hell with the calendar. This man's death day is the end of the 20th century." (His most famous compositions are "New York, New York," "My Way"

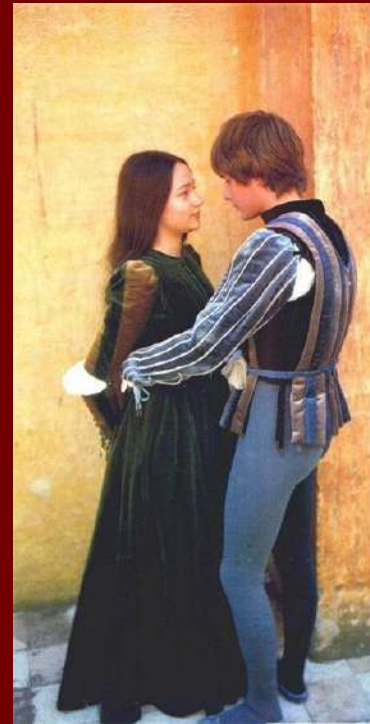
